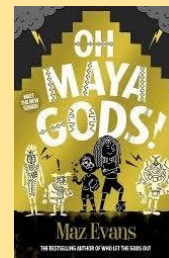

## Year 5 National Curriculum content

### Word

Converting **nouns** or **adjectives** into **verbs** using **suffixes** e.g. -ate, -ise, -ify. Verb **prefixes** e.g. dis-, de-, mis-, over-, re-

### Sentence

- **Relative clauses** beginning with who, which, where, when whose, that, or an omitted relative pronoun.
- Indicating degrees of possibility using **adverbs** e.g. perhaps, surely, or **modal verbs** e.g. might, should, will, must.

### Text

- Devices to build cohesion within a paragraph e.g. then, after that, this, firstly
- Linking ideas across paragraphs using adverbials of time, place and number, or tense choices e.g. he *had* seen her before.

### Punctuation

- Brackets, dashes or commas to indicate parenthesis
- Use of commas to clarify meaning or avoid ambiguity.

### Key vocabulary: Tier 2 and 3

#### Brackets

Are used to tell the reader additional information about a sentence

#### Parenthesis

A word, phrase or sentence that is used as extra information when using brackets, dashes or commas.

#### Modal Verb

Verbs that indicate likelihood, ability, permission or obligation.

#### Informal

A writing style that is used to speak more freely, chatty, relaxed or friendly.

#### Dashes

A punctuation technique to indicate a parenthesis within a sentence, it is normally used to connect to independent clauses.

#### Examples of sentences taught this half-term,

#### 1st Sentence type:

**Using Modal Verbs within sentences.** We *might* have a midnight feast.

#### 2nd Sentence type:

**An ing, ed sentence.** Driving to town, he stopped to watch the UFO land.
