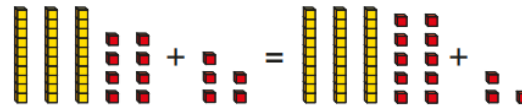

Advice from a Dentist

It is very important to take good care of your teeth. Strong and healthy teeth will help you to chew and eat the right foods that will help you to grow big and strong. Healthy teeth help you to speak clearly too.

Germs can stick to your teeth after you eat and make something called plaque. Plaque can cause holes to form in your teeth if it is not brushed away regularly. Plaque can also make your gums red and sore. If your gums are not healthy, your teeth may start to wobble or fall out. Make sure that you brush your teeth at least twice per day to keep your mouth clean and fresh.
