

## St Paul's Children's Safeguarding Questionnaire Responses 2025-2026

Question 1- I enjoy school	90%	90% of our children said they enjoyed school. From speaking to the children who said they did not enjoy school, the most common reason was that they wanted to stay at home with mummy and daddy. Some of the older children explained that they wanted more time to play or preferred to be at home on their gaming toys.
Question 2- I have friends at school	98%	The majority of children explained that they had lots of friends in school. We spoke with individual children who said they did not, and they are now being supported to extend their friendship groups.
Question 3- I enjoy playtimes and lunchtimes	98%	As above
Question 4- I feel safe at school	95%	Some of the reasons for not feeling safe included being worried about the fire door not opening if there was a fire and worrying that someone might come into school. These concerns have been discussed with the individual children. Some of the younger children would like more buddying programmes from Year 6 children. We will action this in the Spring term.
Question 5- Children behave well	96%	The majority of the children were able to give lots of examples of how well the children behave. We will continue to work with our school pupil behaviour team to ensure these high expectations continue.
Question 6- I know who to talk to if I am worried about something	98%	Children were able to name lots of people they can speak to if they have a concern.
Question 7- I am confident to talk to people in school about any questions, concerns and problems	99%	We have worked hard throughout the year to help build up children's confidence to talk about any concerns they have.
Question 8- Adults listen to me and take action	100%	All children agreed that adults listen to them and take action when necessary.
Question 9- I am taught how to stay safe online	100%	All children sign an acceptable use agreement before they use technology online. Each unit within computing starts with an E-Safety lesson. We have regular discussions with all children about how to stay safe online and

		newsletters are sent out to parents on a monthly basis.
Question 10-My school addresses any form of bullying	100%	All children recognised that as a school we do not tolerate bullying and if there is a case reported, it is dealt with immediately.
Question 11- My school raises awareness of anti-bullying	100%	As above
Question 12- My school is helping me to take responsibility for my own actions	98%	We will continue to work with the small number of children who feel that we do not support them to take responsibility for their own actions.
Question 13- I think my lessons- I learn things in my lessons	99%	The children who did not like their lessons would prefer to be playing games.
Question 14- My parents are told how I get on at school	100%	
Question 15- My teacher encourages me to make good progress in school	99%	Teachers will continue to support the individual children who do not feel that they are encouraged to make good progress.
Question 16- I feel included in group activities	98%	After speaking with individual children, most explained that on occasions they preferred not to play a game or complete an activity that other children were doing. We will continue to observe this and offer support where needed.
Question 17- There are lots of clubs in school	99%	We offer a range of clubs before school, during school and after school.
Question 18- Children are asked for their thoughts on school life	99%	
Question 19- The school environment is clean and welcoming	98%	Some of the older children felt that not all of the children left the bathrooms as clean as they should be.
